A treble of accolades, Debate Mate Attendance Award, West Midland League and the Debate Mate Cup were secured via an outstanding display of intellectual wit and linguistic style by our students.

The day was split up into the three section and throughout the day students made their way around a Biology, Chemistry and Physics table. While at each table they received tuition upon the trickiest elements of each subject in preparation for their upcoming examinations. ## Vinyl Record Research Yr12 Business April 2018

Yr12 BTEC Business students visited 'The Diskery', a vinyl record store in Birmingham in April 2018. Students were collecting primary research to be able to complete the marketing campaign external assessment. Staff members were interviewed by the students. Some of the questions were based around target market, trends, promotion and technology.

The research collected was then used as justification for their own campaign in the external assessment. Whilst in the store, students were able to look at a number of vinyls including some collectors' items, and listen to one. It was the first time they had experienced this, for a number of the group.



## Year 10 Science Trip

On Thursday 17th May 2018 10-Phy1 visited the Thinktank to supplement their Science course.

They found out the answers to some interesting questions, for example:

- How long it takes the International Space Station to orbit the Earth
- What happens if you didn't have a space suit in space
- How our brains react to different stimuli

The students also had a private planetarium session where they found out about how to locate the North star, the relative sizes of the planets in the solar system and the future of our Sun.



## Sixth Form University Trip

The "Maths within A-Level Chemistry" trip at Birmingham University was a great opportunity for students to revisit their knowledge over the past year. I was very impressed how quickly the students grasped the knowledge and were able to answer even the most difficult questions.

Aston University aimed at allowing the students to use highly precise equipment often used in laboratories. It was a great mix of hands-on experiments coupled with applying their subject knowledge throughout A-Level Biology. Students extracted DNA from strawberries and then extracted DNA from a sample to amplify. These techniques are commonly used in laboratories and it was a great opportunity for students to get a taste for their possible future careers.



## National Youth Orchestra

In the Easter break, a group of ten musical students from our academy took part in an exciting project with the National Youth Orchestra of Great Britain (NYO). The students became "Young Promoters" and spent the day at Symphony Hall, Birmingham organising the "NYO Teen Hangout", which provides a friendly environment to meet NYO musicians, enjoy some free snacks, relax before the concert begins, and discover the stories behind the music!

The students did a fantastic job of planning, marketing and hosting the event for the NYO. Afterwards the students saw the orchestra perform in concert which the students described as "amazing" and "absolutely brilliant". 
## B-SIDE PROJECT 2018
